# YET ANOTHER RECORD YEAR FOR GRANT DISTRIBUTIONS IN BC

The KidSport program in BC continued to see an increased demand from families in need in communities across the province in 2024. The BC Provincial Chapter, along with our 39 community chapters across the province helped fund a season of sport for 10,695 kids, distributing \$3,629,075 in grants for sport registration fees. These totals represent another nearly 40% increase over 2023 results, meaning 2024 was another record year for the KidSport program in BC.

We are grateful to all of our partners and donors across BC for sharing our belief in the power of sport. Your support played an important role in helping provide a season of sport for more kids this past year than ever before in our program's history.






### TOTAL GRANTS BY REGION

To be eligible for funding, the child must be registered with a sport club that is affiliated with a member sport organization of Sport BC and demonstrates a sustained sport experience led by a qualified coach. 

#### A NEW ERA FOR KIDSPORT BC

Looking at the last decade of grants, the following chart illustrates the number of grants and dollars distributed since 2014. In the previous 6 years before the pandemic (2014–2019) grant numbers remained relatively steady, while dollars distributed saw marginal annual increases, totaling approximately 30% over the 6-year period. This is in stark contrast to recent years when grant totals increased at a much more rapid rate, effectively doubling from 2022 to 2024.

# MALINDI ELMORE NAMED KIDSPORT COMMUNITY CHAMPION

Olympic marathoner, Malindi Elmore was honoured with the KidSport Community Champion award at Sport BC's 57<sup>th</sup> Annual Athlete of the Year Awards. The three-time Olympian and mom of two, teamed up with the local KidSport chapter where she lives in Kelowna to host a special advanced screening of CBC's "Running a Revolution", which documents women's struggle for equality in the marathon event, and Malindi's inspiring journey to Paris 2024.

Proceeds from ticket sales for the event were donated to KidSport. Funds were also raised through an online silent auction, sales of exclusive 'Run Malindi Run' t-shirts, and online donations. In true Olympic fashion, Malindi exceeded her original \$24,000 fundraising goal, raising \$26,700 for KidSport, which will fund a season of sport for approximately 90 kids.

"I am so honoured and humbled by this recognition and have been inspired by the advocacy of Evan Dunfee for many years championing this worthy cause. I believe that every child has the right to participate in sport and that the benefits of sport last a lifetime. # WHITECAPS 50/50 PROGRAM - CONTINUED SUCCESS

KidSport was thrilled to continue as the charity partner for the Vancouver Whitecaps 50/50 program for the 2024 season - our most successful one yet! This season we held 23 draws with sales totaling \$876,100, which resulted in approximately \$350,000 to support our granting program (once winners and expenses were paid). At \$400/child that funds a season of sport for 875 kids!
